President's message . . .

Put a red circle around the weekend of April 24th, 2010. This is the spring planting day for the Heritage Rose District of New York City. As of now, we have a list of 10 potential new sites and we're looking for at least 200 heritage roses. Got any extras to spare?

To be included in our project the roses require a historical or cultural connection to the neighborhood. For example, in front of the Hispanic Society of America we planted the found rose "Puerto Rico". In the gardens of the Morris-Jumel Mansion, the oldest house in Manhattan (1765) we planted *Rosa setigera*. Our plant of this species was grown from a cutting taken from *R. setigera* in the garden of oldest house in Philadelphia, Wyck (1690). Garden records at Wyck document this rose to be in their garden as early as 1820. Our plant was a gift from a member.

If it were not for the generosity of our members, the Historic Rose District may never have become a reality. As we prepare for the April planting, we are once again looking for donations. Recently, two nurseries offered roses - Roses of Yesterday and Today (California) and Northland Rosarium (Washington). Dr. Malcolm Manners of Florida Southern College is propagating a new batch of roses from his campus rose collection and is looking into the possibility of having some of his students join us for planting day. Pat Shanley, a Foundation board member from Oyster Bay, New York has offered to purchase two large resin planters to be used on Audubon Terrace, home to the Hispanic Society of America.

Thank you all for continuing to support our organization and our ongoing mission to preserve heritage roses.

ÉTIENNE'S BUDWOOD REPORT

Some very important work has been going on in Europe. HRF Trustees Étienne Bouret and Fabien Ducher, among many other dedicated conservators, have obtained Budwood for a stunning number of endangered roses. Anne Belovich says it best; we shall have her describe this important work. Here is her description of Étienne's Budwood List:

"... a list of all the heritage rose varieties that Étienne and several other people have recently obtained from some of the public gardens in Europe and will be made available to commerce. These roses were previously unavailable to people outside of these gardens. Now, this long list of rare roses can soon be ordered for import by anyone with a permit.

Étienne has also obtained budwood for me from a special group of Ramblers growing at the Roseraie de l'Hay in Paris and has sent them to the Loubert Nursery for propagation. They will soon be arriving here for me to add to my Rambler collection and to share with others.

Among them are four roses from American hybridizers that have been lost to commerce in this country for a great many years. They are 'Pink Roamers' (Horvath/Manda), 'South Orange Perfections' (Horvath/Manda), 'Troubadour' (Walsh), and 'Cinderella' (Walsh).

Here is Étienne's report:

1. I've been able to collect budwood on 35 HPs of L'Hay.
